Graduates Surveyed

For this survey, the pool consisted of a total of 623 graduates (bachelors, master's and doctoral degrees) from 2017 and 2021. Two emails were sent to graduates during July 2022 requesting their participation during a three-week period. One \$50 Amazon gift card and five \$25 Amazon gift cards were awarded to randomly selected participants. A total of 36 responses were received, resulting in a 6% response rate.

The participants identified the following as their graduation year:

Participants are asked to indicate their undergraduate major or graduate program. Of 36 responses, 31(86%) indicated completion of an undergraduate degree and 5 (14%) indicated completion of a master's degree. Based on a review of participants' degrees, a total of 6 students (17%) who completed the survey were part of a COEE program. All of those students completed an undergraduate degree through a COEE program.



Results from the survey are summarized in the following pages.

Guidance from NU faculty or staff

Out of 36 responses, 29 participants (81%) said that they sought guidance from NU faculty or staff in regard to next steps (employment, graduate school, etc.), while 7 individuals (19%) did not seek guidance.



Among graduates with an undergraduate degree, 26 (84%) individuals indicated they sought guidance, while 5 (16%) graduates responded that they did not seek guidance. Of the 5 students responding no, 3 students were in COEE programs.

Among graduates with a graduate degree, 3 (60%) individuals indicated they sought guidance, while 2 (40%) graduates responded that they did not seek guidance.

Satisfaction with guidance

Of the 29 graduates who sought guidance in regard to next steps from NU staff or faculty, 15 participants (52%) said that they were very satisfied, 12 individuals (41%) were satisfied, and 2 participants (7%) said they were not satisfied.



Among the 26 graduates with an undergraduate degree who indicated they sought guidance, 12 participants (46%) said that they were very satisfied, 12 individuals (46%) were satisfied, and 2 participants (8%) said they were not satisfied.

Among the 3 graduates with a graduate degree who sought guidance, all participants (100%) said that they were very satisfied.



Employment and NU studies

25 individuals responded to Question 11. 18 participants (72%) indicated that they were employed in a field related to their major or program, 6 participants (24%) indicated that they were employed in a field unrelated to their major or program by choice, and 1 participant (4%) indicated they were employed in an unrelated field, not by their choice.



Among the 21 graduates with an undergraduate degree who responded to this question, 15 participants (71%) indicated they were employed in a field related to their major, 5 individuals (24%) marked they were in a field unrelated to their major by choice, and 1 participant (5%) said they were employed in an unrelated field not by choice.

Among the 4 graduates with a graduate degree who responded to this question, 3 participants (75%) indicated they were employed in a field related to their major, 1 individual (25%) marked they were in a field unrelated to their major by choice, and no participants said they were employed in an unrelated field not by choice.

Preparation

31 participants responded to this question. 13 participants (42%) said that their NU experience prepared them well for their career and/or graduate studies, 15 participants (48%) said that their NU experience prepared them, and 4 (13%) said that they were not well prepared. Of the graduates who responded, 90% indicated they were prepared or well prepared for their career and/or graduate studies.

Of the 26 participants with an undergraduate degree who responded to this question, 8 (31%) said that their NU experience prepared them well for their career and/or graduate studies, 14 participants (54%) said that their NU experience prepared them, and 4 (15%) said that they were not well prepared.

Of the 5 participants with a graduate degree who responded to this question, all 5 (100%) said that their NU experience prepared them well for their career and/or graduate studies, with no participants sayring that their NU experience prepared them or that they were not prepared.
